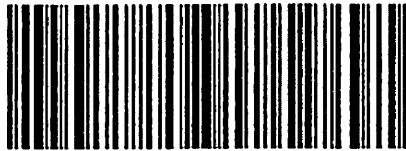

Notice of Intent to Levy

This notice is your Notice of Intent to Levy (Internal Revenue Code Section 6331 (d)).

If you don't pay the amount due within 30 days from the date of this notice, we can levy your state tax refund. We may also serve a Disqualified Employment Tax Levy or a Federal Contractor Levy, as explained in the enclosed Publication 594, IRS Collection Process. In most other situations, before we levy on your property or rights to property, we will send you a notice that gives you the opportunity to request a Collection Due Process hearing.

Property or rights to property includes:

- Wages, real estate commissions, and other income
- Bank accounts
- Personal assets (e.g., your car and home)
- Social security benefits

Rights to request an appeal

If you don't agree with our intent to levy, you have the right to request an appeal under the Collection Appeals Program. Please call 1-800-829-8374 or send us a Collection Appeal Request (Form 9423) to the address at the top of the notice within 30 days from the date of this notice. What you need to know—continued

Denial or revocation of United States passport

On December 4, 2015, as part of the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act, Congress enacted section 7345 of the Internal Revenue Code, which requires the Internal Revenue Service to notify the State Department of taxpayers certified as owing a seriously delinquent tax debt. The FAST Act generally prohibits the State Department from issuing or renewing a passport to a taxpayer with seriously delinquent tax debt. Seriously delinquent tax debt means an unpaid, legally enforceable federal tax debt of an individual totaling more than \$50,000 that has been assessed and for which a Notice of Federal Tax lien has been filed and all administrative remedies under IRC § 6320 have lapsed or been exhausted, or a levy has been issued. If you are individually liable for tax debt (including penalties and interest) totaling more than \$50,000 and you do not pay the amount you owe or make alternate arrangements to pay, we may notify the State Department that your tax debt is seriously delinquent. The State Department generally will not issue or renew a passport to you after we make this notification. If you currently have a valid passport, the State Department may revoke your passport or limit your ability to travel outside of the United States. Payment options

Pay now electronically

We offer free payment options to securely pay your tax bill directly from your checking account or savings account. When you pay online or from your mobile device, you can:

- Receive instant confirmation of your payment
- Schedule payments in advance
- Modify or cancel a payment before the due date

You can also pay by debit or credit card for a small fee. To see all of our payment options, visit www.irs.gov/payments.

Payment plans

If you can't pay the full amount you owe, pay as much as you can now and make arrangements to pay your remaining balance. Visit www.irs.gov/paymentplan for more information on installment agreements and online payment agreements. You can also call us at 1-800-829-8374 to discuss your options.

Offer in Compromise

An offer in compromise allows you to settle your tax debt for less than the full amount you owe. If we accept your offer, you can pay with either a lump sum cash payment plan or periodic payment plan. To see if you qualify, use the Offer in Compromise Pre-Qualifier tool on our website. For more information, visit www.irs.gov/offers.

If we don't hear from you

If you don't pay the amount due immediately or make payment arrangements, we can file a Notice of Federal Tax Lien on your property at any time or we may levy (subject to any applicable Collection Due Process rights).

If we file a lien, it may be difficult to sell or borrow against your property. A tax lien will also appear on your credit report – which may harm your credit rating – and your creditors would also be publicly notified that the IRS has priority to seize your property.

Interest charges

We are required by law to charge interest when you do not pay your liability on time. Generally, we calculate interest from the due date of your return (regardless of extensions) until you pay the amount you owe in full, including accrued interest and any penalty charges. Interest on some penalties accrues from the date we notify you of the penalty until it is paid in full. Interest on other penalties, such as failure to file a tax return, starts from the due date or extended due date of the return. Interest rates are variable and may change quarterly. (Internal Revenue Code Section 6601)

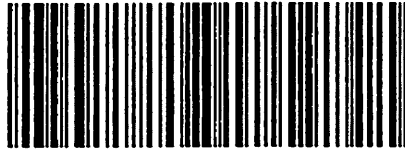

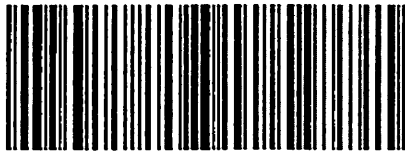
