Dear Dr. Trowbridge,

We have received your complaint and request for a grand jury convened here in Harris County to review same.

Texas law provides for the following process, which we follow:

When an attorney or private citizen requests to present a matter directly to a grand jury, the appropriate procedure is to prepare a complaint and list of any evidence relevant to the grand jury's consideration. The evidence itself can be included, but photos are recommended. All of the information should be delivered to the Harris County District Attorney's Office, Attn: Grand Jury Division Chief.

Our procedure is for the Division Chief to present that complaint/issue to the grand jury for their independent consideration. It is within the authority and discretion of the grand jury to determine whether or not the complaint/issue is a criminal offense and whether or not evidence of probable cause exists. Should a grand jury request presentation of testimony or additional evidence on the matter, they will instruct the prosecutor to notify witnesses or obtain the additional evidence.


If the grand jury determines that the complaint/issue is not a criminal matter appropriate for their consideration, or decide they do not want testimony or additional evidence, then the Harris County District Attorney's Office, by and through the Grand Jury Division Chief, shall notify the submitting attorney or private citizen of that decision.

A grand jury is a powerful entity in Texas law and this Office guards against any attempt by anyone who attempts misuse of its authority for any purpose, including but not limited to an attempt to gain advantage in a civil suit, retaliation through false claims of criminal behavior, or for publicity of any kind. The grand jury is a critical part of our

criminal justice system never to be used for any purpose other than its intended purpose of being a check and balance on law enforcement and a protector of the truth.

In this instance, since we have received your complaint through personal receipt by the District Attorney, we will follow our usual protocol. Depending on the reaction of the Grand Jury, we will inform you as to the outcome.
